" 忙"是當今許多人經常要面對的問題。

我們對" 忙"似乎是又愛又恨,愛"忙"是因為許多人可以從" 忙"的狀態裡得到一些在其他方面得不到的自我肯定,"忙"帶來了不被人論斷再是閒人那一點點的自我安慰,"忙"也會讓我們自己覺得不是一個不求上進的人…"忙"在今天的世代裡更變成了有希望有前景的代名詞!

但事實上,"忙"也時常會令人不安。

"忙"使得我們生活緊張,人與人之間原來該有的各種情感被壓縮,以致於彼此的關係也就自然地逐漸疏遠了。"忙"的腳步讓人變成了有如一顆在巨大機器裡的小螺絲釘一般,慢慢地失去了自主權,所以我們常聽到有人嘆息說:唉!人在江湖,身不由己啊…

"忙"令我們好像坐在遊樂場裡那部上下起 伏又快速的過山車一樣,時而興奮時而驚 嚇,但人坐在裡面似乎無計可施,只有等著 什麼時候到了站,解開了綁在腰上的那條 "安全帶"(忙)後才能真正地喘一口氣似 的。

請仔細地看一看,"忙"這個字拆開來唸就 是心的死亡(心在左邊,亡在右邊)。我們 若生活在那無止無休的忙忙碌碌裡,是不是 很容易就失去了屬靈的洞察力、從而無法經歷到神在我們生命裡所預備的各樣恩典?想一想一個每天都已經忙碌到精疲力盡的人, 又怎能靜得下來一顆原能體貼聖靈的心呢?!

開車在路上,我們每天都常被提醒,車子須要在時速的限制之内行駛,但是往往我們還是有意無意地超速,這其實是一種僥倖的心理,總是認為偶爾為之是件無傷大雅的事。同理,我們也是這樣告訴自己:沒關係,忙過這一陣子就會好一點了。讓我們來認清楚一個事實:有幾個人是真正可以突然在某一天"覺悟"過來而又歸回到一個平靜安穩的生活裡呢?"忙"隱藏在現代人的血液之中,有一天不忙起來就變得渾身不對勁,心裡就難免擔心嘀咕起來,是不是我努力的不夠呢?我要是不再忙的話,會不會很快地就被那不斷進步的社會所淘汰了呢?我們不忙那不就表示了自己已經是落伍了嗎?

2009 年我個人也被這個"忙"所困擾著, 傳道人要常在主的面前禱告靈修,我顯然不 夠,這不是我不想,而是我在"忙"著一些 永遠也做不完的服事,但卻將原本一件更為 重要的事給耽誤了下來…

以賽亞書 30:15 主耶和華以色列的聖者曾如此說: "你們得救在乎歸回安息;你們得力在乎平靜安穩。你們竟自不肯 (but you would have none of it)。"

想要從神那裡獲得幫助和能力的話,首先我們要在這個匆忙的世界中放緩一下那急速的腳步。

事實擺在眼前,今天的世界是一個凡事講求效率要求快捷的世界,人們追求省時省力。 進步的科技把地球變小了,超音速的飛機、 國際網路…但是今天人們的工作時數又果真 是減少了嗎?是不是在這種日趨便捷的環境 中就得到了相對該有的休息呢?

不斷加速的生活步調使我們付上了極大的代價,其中當然包括了一些對生命而言是我們應該要珍惜的東西…每一天我們都要比前一天忙,永遠做不完的事,結果我們就不會再有時間和精力去培養或是享受一些友誼了,不單如此,另外我們還被常提醒到要注意周圍其他的人的需要,結果是搞得自己的身心靈都疲憊不堪。

心"亡"了是一件可怕的事,我們今天可能 還是要停下來問一問自己的心,一個很實際 的問題:"你無止境的在忙究竟是為了什 麼?"。

神要我們得力歸向祂,是要我們先安靜下來,觀察並仰望祂的作為,我們生活的步調若快得像那飛馳中的跑車一般,又如何能顧及到在生命中真正重要的事呢?

我不知道你今天的情況如何?但我只知道一件事…你若真想要得到一個豐盛的生命,那你要有魄力的(更需要謙卑)先來到神這裡,求主的幫助安靜下來你的心,信靠祂,交出你那顆煩躁的心,交出你的主權,恢復與祂原來那親密的關係,因為你可能正在忙著許多其實在神看來一點也不重要的事情!





# 理事會主席:屬靈的恩賜和理事會

2009 年教會的主題是成全聖徒,各盡其職。這是從以弗所書 4:12 而來。同樣在這第 4 章中,使徒保羅論述了從基督而來的屬靈恩賜(11 節-他所賜的,有使徒,有先知,有傳福音的,有牧師和教師)。原意說那些有屬靈恩賜的能够去影响其他人,以至於「全身都靠他聯絡得合式,百節各按各職,照着各體的功用彼此相助,便叫身體漸漸增長,在愛中建立自己。」(16 節),「連於元首基督」(15 節)。

一班親愛的同工的支持,也有牧師的帶領和 指導,使我得以完成2009年的工作。除 了参與計劃中既有的差傳項目,如初次舉辦 的短宣訓練課程、南亞裔跨文化研討會、每 年既定的差傳年會外,還有以下的三個項 目。在這些事工中,神讓我有很多的學習和 感受。

#### 1. 泰北事工

去年三月,我同三位英語堂的弟兄姊妹一同 再往泰北及緬甸短宣,参與兒童英語聖經班 的事奉。我看見神賜與他們愛心和活力,在 這羣天真可愛的兒童身上彰顯祂的愛:我也 看見當地確實很缺乏神的工人,尤其是對可 参與屬靈培訓的同工需求殷切。神還給我們 有另一個看見:

#### 回顧過去

從 2000 年起,本教會與華傳合作,差派李傳頌弟兄一家為宣教士前往當地服事開荒。 2005 年黃牧師探訪該區宣教工場,次年郭定牧師亦前往該區,直接參與了伯特利聖經學院和晨曦會門訓中心的教學和其他的宣教事工。繼而教會的弟兄姊妹也開始參與短宣工作,至今泰緬的宣教事工已成為本教會差傳的持續項目。在這段日子裡,神讓我們看到了對該區的華人和山地上的少數民族,特別是對下一代如兒童及年青人的傳福音、靈命塑造、門徒培訓以及生活照顧等各方面的需要。我們也見証了該區有許多學生中心和門訓中心被建立起來,惟「莊稼已熟,作工的人少」!

新的異象

近年來,我們看見神祝福並保守了這個稱為「福音金三角」的地方,使祂的福音得以持續擴展。福音金三角連接了緬甸、寮國,北至中國的雲南,西至越南,有如魚網分佈。因其地理位置便利,福音金三角已成為宣教及培訓門徒的中心。

我們最近由當地的同工得知,在清萊郊區的兩所大學裡,來自中國的留學生已有 600 多人:另外,來自泰國各地的泰人中,攻讀漢語系的學生亦超過了千人,大學生的福音工作可能成為另一需要。

神讓我們看到,這是一個極具潛力的福音系場,我們可以制定固定的計劃支持當地的培訓事工,與當地的福音機構掛鈎,彼此配搭。這樣,我們每年派出的、前往泰北支援並配合當地兒童與學生事工的短宣隊伍,將不再是無的放矢的探訪,而是逐步實現差傳部兩年前所訂的計劃,並將資源集中使用。若這異象真是從神而來,那就願神祝福這項事工可以順利開展。

#### 2. 魁北克一 O. J. 原著民短宣體驗

感謝兩位姐妹同工及三位年青會衆的辛勞, 他們組成了本教會的短宣隊,與多倫多的一 間教會共同完成此次短宣。我們盼望在 2010年可以在本教會自己組隊,激發更多年 青會衆的宣教心志,做到薪火相傳。雖然我 沒有参與這次短宣,但仍然從他們的分享中 受到鼓勵。一位姐妹同工曾詢問當地一對華 人牧師夫婦,「為何會留在那偏遠的地區, 而不在多倫多事奉呢?」他們回答:「因為 神給我們的恩賜少,所以我們留下來事奉土 著社羣。」這使我感動和慚愧!如果說他們 有不足,不如說是我有不足----我沒有他們這樣的謙卑、順服、和宣教的熱忱!

#### 3. 植堂事工

我們去年開始在美頓市植堂。雖然並無充足的經驗,但是福音基址與本教會一班同工的愛心、信心和努力,使我佩服。感謝神的恩典,使我有份參與。起初我因為職份的需要参與工作,但礙於語言不便、沒有受過裝備,我只是憑着願意的心跟隨牧師前往探訪和關顧國內來的移民、慕道者和基督徒。他們對福音的需要和渴求,還有預料以外的家庭輔導的需要等等,使得牧師們要很吃力地奔跑兩地,作屬靈教導的工作。作事務的我,只能在他旁邊呆着、看着,不能做什麼,這使我內心倍感慚愧和虧欠!

#### 4. 自我反思

我不斷問自已,神已經讓我看見無論是在教會內還是在教會外,都滿是人的需要,我還可以逃避嗎?我還可以有藉口說我沒有這份 恩賜、或說未準備好去面對人嗎?

在一次傳道部同工靈修聚會的禱告中,神藉着一位親愛的姐妹引導我,感動我要起來行動去裝備自己,為祂所用。神更籍著牧師、長者和弟兄姊妹的引證,鼓勵我們去接受全面的、基本的神學訓練。回想過去,就看見原來神已經一步一步地給我們帶領和準備,只看我是否有願意的心,踏出第一步!

其實在多年前,我就曾經在工作上很困擾, 落入孤單和無助之中。我在禱告中求問神 :「誰是老闆?誰可以給我支持?」神很清 楚地給了我答案 : 他是天上那位無所不能的老闆。這使我從淚水中得到釋放。從此,我將我的生活和事業看為我的生命裡的一部份,為主而活。在往後的日子裏,我不斷祈求神清楚地指示我,祂究竟在我餘下的生命中有什麼計劃,要我做什麼,要我去哪裏,但是祂總不給我答案。後來我才體會到,原來神早已吩咐了我,就如馬太福音 28:19-20 說:「所以你們要去,使萬民作我的門徒,奉父、子、聖靈的名,給他們施洗;凡我所吩咐你們的,都教訓他們遵守;我就常與你們同在,直到世界的末了」。祂要我憑信心去每天一步一步地跟隨著祂!

親愛的弟兄姊妹們都很關心我們,擔心我在這個年齡的體力和能力可否應付全日制那麽緊密的神學課程。我也曾問過自己,但是我不能再拖延回應神的呼召了。既然我已將餘下的生命擺上,被主塑造,我就相信能力也是從神而來,我只管盡本份去做。最近我再次反思這個問題,又領受到好像神要我用一生來學習謙卑和順服的功課,連接受裝備也不可誇耀自己的能力,要全然倚靠祂,並經歷祂給我們的恩典!學院裏的學兄學姊的分享已經見證了這一點。

很奇妙,我原本在差傳部的事奉是要學習去用宣教的熱情去激勵大家,現在反倒被親愛的弟兄姐妹所激勵和支持,差派到神學院這裡來學習。我願意在靈命上重新被神塑造,成為祂合用的瓦器。藉此感謝你們的愛心,願我們一同分享神賜給教會這豐盛的恩典。

願與親愛的弟兄姐妹們共勉,讓大家也經歷「知」  $\rightarrow$  「情」  $\rightarrow$  「意」 $\rightarrow$  「行」 的感動,一同起來行動,彼此配搭,各盡其

職,讓教會成為有活力、有行動的差傳教會。願一切荣耀、頌讚都歸於神!

## 主日學部 (英文)

#### 李凱能

首先,我要向所有熱心承擔 BCBC 主日學工作的老師和同工表示感謝。我們祈禱神在各個方面保守及獎賞他們的愛和付出。

英語主日學目前分為三個班:7-8年級,9-12年級,及成人班。雖然他們在學習神的話語的深度和廣度上的要求有所不同,但他們有一點是相同的——就是他們都需要在這部門承擔工作的兄弟姐妹們的誠心侍奉。

今年,有一個在成人班引進的名為"真理問題"的系列受到了很好的反應。以下是關於"真理問題"的簡單介紹:

關注家庭出版的 真理問題"是一部 DVD 小組課程,由 12 節 Del Tacket 博士教授的 1 小時課程組成。這部關於家庭的課程是從聖經的角度看人生的啓始點。每節課都細致地探討以基督徒的世界觀來對待日常生活的適當性和重要性。

#### **1** - 真理學: 什麼是真理?

"真理問題"以真理的定義開頭:真理是事物客觀規律的反映。這個絕對及恆久的真理曾經是耶穌在世時他的使命的中心,如今也繼續成為現世宇宙征戰的焦點。

#### 2 - 哲學和倫理學:誰的立場?

真理不是一個簡單的學術上的概念。我們認識 真理的途徑直接取決於我們的生活方式。不僅 如此,我們對於對錯的理解也直接取決於我們 的世界觀:宇宙是神創造的還是一個封閉的立 方體?

#### 3 - 人類學: 人是誰?

聖經告訴我們人是神按自己的形象造的,但由 於犯罪而跌到。另一方面,現代心理學聲稱人 之初性本善,隻有受到社會或制度上的壓迫才 變壞。這一課探究兩種觀點的含義。

#### 4 - 神學:神是誰?

永生,按照耶穌所說,是以親密的,個人的, 和相關的方式去認識神。或許隻有因為這樣的 與神的關系,我們才開始在聖靈光照下看清我 們自己,從而由內而外地改變我們。

#### **5** - 科學: 什麽是真的?

科學 , 對自然界的系統研究" ,揭示了無數的智慧創造的証據。然而達爾文的理論卻把誠實探究自然的科學扭曲成傳播無神論的機器。

從對分子生物學和化石的仔細研究中顯示進化 並不是証明了的事實。同時,歷史証明了包括 作為社會哲學的達爾文主義在内的思想,一定 會有把神排除在外的丑陋的后果。

#### 6 - 歷史: 誰的歷史?

過去(the past)有沒有客觀現實和意義?或者如同后現代主義哲學所稱,過去是否主要地存在於我們的頭腦中?這一課討論歷史的意義如同神的故事,並且告訴我們為什麼記住歷史那麼重要。

#### 7 - 社會學:神的烙印

我們在自然界觀察到的規律在神所創建的社會 系統中更加明顯:家庭、教會、社區、政府、 勞工,還有神和人的統一。生活是從三位一體 的大自然造物主流露出來的一連串的關係,同 時反映出大自然造物主的屬性。

#### 8 - 神秘主義:我是孤獨的嗎?

讓這個無限的,永恆的創世者居住在每個個體的心裡是可能的嗎?

這個代表了基督徒信仰核心的偉大奧秘的意義,在細查社會領域的最深處時我們將予以詳盡地考察。

#### **9** - 政府: 誰的法律?

在所有的社會范疇,政府是神給予對罪惡進行 懲罰和對善良給予保存的司法權,如果它超出 它的權限,它最有可能出錯。當官的必須時時 記住他是在神的主權之下,否則將是一場浩 劫。

#### 10 - 美國的試驗:墊腳石

美國在世界歷史中很獨特。在這片陸地上有一個秉持聖經為世界觀的民族有機會建立起一個為把國家保持在神規定的界線裡的政府系統。 第十課是跟隨這個實驗的歷史,來探討當神被遺忘時,自由發生了什麼。

#### 11 - 勞工:被造的去創造

#### 12 - 社區和參與:神所關心的,我呢?

基督徒的生命的道德准則和意義可以歸納成對神和鄰舍的愛這條戒律。這條戒律是信徒為貧困者作出自我犧牲和他們個人參與我們文化的動力的源頭。

我想在此向我們的瞿錦榮弟兄表示真誠的感謝,感謝他為帶領這個主題所作出的貢獻和投入。我們計劃在將來的幾年裡把這個主題帶給9年級到12年級的班級。 算理問題"可以成為建立我們年輕一代靈命的開始,並且引領他們變得更象基督的樣子。我們也需要從我們的兄弟姐妹那兒得到更多的支持來:

做好榜樣-以身作則,

參與侍奉 - 神國的一部分,並且

從我們的錯誤中學會一寬恕。

作為結束語,讓我們一起來努力建造神的國,並 且記住保羅對提摩太的教導: 不可叫人小看你 年輕,總要在言語,行為,愛心,信心和清潔 上,都作信徒的榜樣。"

#### 兒童詩班

#### 聖鄭凱恩

「你們要向耶和華唱新歌,全地都要向耶和華歌唱!」《詩篇》**96:1**。

這是我們兒童詩班今年的主題。每一周,我們的目標是要學一首新歌,或者是'老歌新唱'。合唱是基督身體合一的一個好例子,是參與者以平等身份敬拜神的機會,沒有人獨顯身手,也沒有人被冷落。這節詩篇祇是說要向神歌唱,而沒有說要唱得多麼優美。然而,詩班不僅僅是唱詩。詩班員練唱其實是學習過一個與神同在的人生。怎樣將詩班的原理應用到我們的屬靈生命?

聆聽。你聽到了甚麼?可能是外面的風聲、是街上交通嘈雜聲?是建築物周圍人們的走路聲?是寂靜?真有寂靜嗎?在詩班裏,第一個原則就是「聆聽」。這條原則沒有明確規定聽誰的或聽甚麼。這條原則不是講順服,而是講做醒。聆聽是知道周圍環境。當我們聆聽時,我們學習辨認聲音、周圍人或事物的出現和運動。為了唱得好,我們必須聆聽 — 知道周圍人的發聲;知道怎樣和聲。

聽音是辨音的第一步。年輕的撒母耳和以利 在聖殿事奉時學習聆聽。當他夜間聽到呼喚 時,他以為是以利在叫他。他還太年輕,分 辨不出那是上帝的聲音。但是他能感到那時 呼喚的重要和緊迫,因為他在聆聽。如同撒母耳去以利那裏尋找帶領一樣,孩子們也會來到你們父母、導師、老師面前尋找帶領。這個時候,你們會指導孩子直接與神對話嗎?

## 散文、分享、見證

#### 神的回應

多年前,每逢星期四的上午,我都會帶一些 慕道朋友往梁國光博士家中聚會,每次都有 已信主的或是慕道的朋友參加。

梁博士憶述,有一次喬宏叔( 當年他仍在世 ) 對他說,他近來覺得神好像離他很遠,便向神禱告,求神給他一些事,讓他釋懷,請神回答他。不久之後,喬宏叔自己駕車前往錄音室。快要到錄音室時,不知爲何,汽車突然向前衝去,眼看就要撞到錄音室的牆壁。他本人當時好像被提起。奇怪!沒有剎車,車卻停了。他被嚇得滿頭大汗,平靜下來後,下車視察,看見車頭與牆之間距離剛可以伸入一隻手掌。錄音室的牆壁特別厚重堅實。如果撞個正著,則後果不堪設想。他立即感謝神!這是神的回應。我們聽完此見證,深受感動。

那一晚臨睡前,我禱告時,不知為甚麼,忽然也作同樣的禱告:「神啊!我知道祢與我同在,看顧我、保守我,但是我常軟弱,信心不足,懷疑祢是否真正的常與我同在,請您也給我一些經歷,讓我能增加信心,剛強站立。」禱告完,我安然入睡。幾天後,是星期日,我到教會聚會。那間教會借用一所學校作臨時聚會點。聚會完畢,我和往常一樣,午膳後便到兩家超級市場購物。用過晚勝後,由女兒駕車返家。途中我忽然發覺,手上戴著的手鐲不見了,但我沒有因驚恐而大聲喊叫,冤得驚嚇正在駕車的女兒。我安靜地細心想想,撫摸頸項,發覺同一款式的

頸鍊仍在,證明那天我是戴著一套飾物出門 的。一入家門,我立即致電教會負責雜務的 鍾弟兄,告知他我遺失了一隻怎樣款式顏色 的手鐲,請他聯絡學校的校役,讓他們打掃 的時候,留意一下能否找到手鐲。接下來的 一個星期裏,我沒有向鍾弟兄詢問。到了星 期日,又和往常一樣地去教會。我見到鍾弟 兄,他沒有向我提及手鐲的事,我也沒有問 他。學校也沒有回覆。我心裏想,那天我還 到過幾處地方,手鐲不一定遺落在教會。到 了晚上,鍾弟兄來電話,說今天聚會後,他 留在教會--學校禮堂--等朋友。因為間著無 聊,看見有幾個孩子在鋼琴邊玩樂,便走過 去,竟然發現鋼琴上面有一隻手鐲,和我失 去的相似,於是就放在□袋裏帶走。我把手 鐲的形狀及顏色向他複述一次,果然那就是 我所遺失的手鐲。主啊!這真奇妙。手鐲留 在那裏已有兩個多星期。那個禮堂被木板隔 成多個房間,平時木板挪開,方便人們出 入。人們由校門進入禮堂,經不同的通道去 往學校教室和辦公室。學校是公衆地方,每 天有不少學生及其他人出入。手鐲放在鋼琴 上,小孩子可以隨時拿來玩耍或取去,或者 路過的成年人也可能順手牽羊地拿走。手鐲 不是用塑膠製造,而是由白色的玉珠及紅色 的珊瑚珠互串而成的。雖然它不是太名貴, 但也頗精緻,又與頸鍊搭配成一套飾物。我 遺失了手鐲的事,我沒有告訴女兒,所以連 她也不知道。我祇是託鍾弟兄去留意找尋, 就算是有人看見手鐲也不知道是我的。奇妙 的是,鍾弟兄在等候朋友時,那幾個小孩在 鋼琴旁玩耍吸引了他,他才走過去,於是就 看到手鐲。一件飾物放在那裏兩個多星期, 仍然會物歸原主,那不算是奇蹟?一點兒也 不是巧合,乃是神給我的回應!

主啊!您是又真又活的神。您洞察人心,知 我軟弱,需要扶持,加添我的信心,垂聽我 的禱告。這又怎不令我甘心俯伏敬拜祢!

#### 以基督的心為心

使徒保羅在腓立比書二:5 勸勉信徒「當以 基督的心為心」。

甚麼是基督的心呢?在英文 King James Version(KJV)版本中,希臘原文「vovs」被忠實地譯為「The mind of Christ」,即基督的思維與心思意念。「你們當以基督耶穌的心為心,Let this mind be in you,which was also in Christ Jesus。」(腓二:5)「誰曾知道主的心去教導祂呢?但我們是有基督的心了。For who hath known the mind of the Lord, that he may instruct him? But we have the mind of Christ。」(林前二:16)

聖經告訴我們,當我們悔改歸向神,接受主耶穌來到我們生命裏,我們就藉著聖靈重生:聖靈既內住,我們就有了基督的心。「我也要賜給你們一個新心,將新靈放在你們裏面。又從你們的肉體中除掉石心,賜給你們肉心」(結三十六:26):「你們受洗歸入基督的,都是披戴基督了」(加三:27)。「披戴基督」之意,就是穿上新人,在主裏有更新的心志。以弗所書四:23 詳盡地詮釋道:「又要將你們的心志改換一新,並且穿上新人:這新人是照著神的形象造的,有真理的仁義和聖潔。」

當我們重生得救後,就有了基督的心:我們 的心志藉著主的話語和真理而更新變化,能 夠察驗何為神善良、純全、可喜悅的旨意 (羅十二:2)。「因為神賜給我們,不是膽怯的心,乃是剛強、仁愛、謹守的心」(提後一:7)。「謹守的心」在 KJV 版本中譯為「a sound mind」,就是優秀卓越、明哲聰慧的思維,能曉得主的真理,能體貼順服神的心意,叫人不單顧自己的事,也能顧念天國的事---福音的事工。

「因爲他心怎樣思量,他爲人就是怎樣」 (箴二十三:7)。「你要保守你心,勝過保守一切,因為一生的果效,是由心發出」(箴四:23)。「心裏所充滿的,口裏就說出來。善人從他心裏所存的善,就發出善來...」 (太十二:34b-35)。基督徒重生得救後,有了基督的心,有了主的思維,就會漸漸與主耶穌相似。他不僅有真理、仁義和聖潔的性情,更有主耶穌柔和憐憫、恩慈良善、謙卑虚己的樣式,在生命中結出聖靈的果子,彰顯登山寶訓所描繪的天國子民的美德佳行。他的生命中流露出主豐盛的生命,從榮耀到榮耀,屬靈生命不斷地成長更新。

脱去舊人,穿上新人 — 屬靈生命成聖過程

信徒得救是本乎恩,也因著信,藉著基督的 寶血,救恩已經一次性地成就在信祂的人身 上。然而,信徒屬靈生命的成長,卻是一個 漸進的過程。從初生的屬靈嬰孩,到滿有基 督長成的身量,不是一蹴而就的,而是漸漸 成長的。(參閱彼前二:1、2:林前十 三:11:來五:13-14)

「你們學了基督,卻不是這樣。如果你們聽過祂的道,領了祂的教,學了祂的真理,就要脫去你們從前行為上的舊人,這舊人是因私慾的迷惑漸漸變壞的;又要將你們的心志改換一新,並且穿上新人;這新人是照著神的形象造的,有真理的仁義和聖潔」(弗四:20-24);「因你們已經脫去舊人和舊人

的行為,穿上了新人;這新人在知識上漸漸更新,正如造他主的形象」(西三:9-10)。基督徒屬靈生命的成長,就是要不斷地脫去舊人的思想行為,不再隨從肉體而行;從積極方面講,就是穿上新人,在思想行為上不斷地藉著主的道、主的真理而更新和變化。使徒保羅在加拉太書第五章裏很詳細地詮釋了甚麼是顯而易見的、順從肉體情慾的舊我所結的果子,以及甚麼是與其相對的、順服聖靈的新生命所結的果子。

基督徒屬靈生命得勝、得力的秘訣,在於其思想行為的更新。靠著聖靈得生,靠著聖靈行事,就可以不放縱肉體的情慾。聖經在這方面的訓誡教導著墨甚濃,顯示出順著聖靈而行的重要性。

#### 思想中屬靈的戰場

「你要保守你心,勝過保守一切」(箴四:23)。「上帝所賜出人意外的平安,必在基督耶穌裏保守你們的心懷意念。」(腓四:7)。我們的心懷意念非常重要,故此,我們要在主裏恆切、做醒地保守它。信徒屬靈爭戰的戰場就在心思意念中,仇敵魔鬼常用謊言詭計來攻擊信徒,扭曲神的真理。魔鬼也常用引誘試探來迷惑信徒,用恐懼、猜疑、焦慮、挫折感等思想來攻擊信徒的心思,使信徒灰心喪志,懷疑神的真道,也懷疑神的慈愛信實,從而遠離了神。因此,信徒需要用主的真理作爲心裏的力量,穿戴上神所賜的全副軍裝,靠著聖靈的大能抵擋仇敵,才能站立得住。(參閱弗六:10-18)

#### 身心靈全人的救恩

「願賜平安的上帝親自使你們全然成聖。又 願你們的靈與魂與身子得蒙保守,在我主耶 穌基督降臨的時候,完全無可指摘」(帖前 五:23)。 這裏提到信徒靈、魂、體(身心靈)三方面的救贖。在重生得救時,我們已經得贖。神使我們那沉睡的、因罪而與神隔絕的靈甦醒,恢復了我們與神的關係。祂為自己的名引導我們走義路,羔羊的寶血就是神與我們立約的憑據(參閱林前十一:25)。 我們也得著聖靈的印記,就是永生基業的確據(弗一:13-14)。

我們的身體在主基督再來時,將得到完全的 救贖

「不但如此,就是我們這有聖靈初結果子的也是自己心裏歎息,等候得著兒子的名分,乃是我們的身體得贖」(羅八:23)。「我們卻是天上的國民,並且等候救主,就是主耶穌基督,從天上降臨。祂要按著那能叫萬有歸服自己的大能,將我們這卑賤的身體改變形狀,和祂自己榮耀的身體相似」。(腓三:20-21)

我們的魂(即「心」,知識、思維、情感、意志的總和)的成聖,是一個漸進的、不斷的、成長的過程,也就是使徒保羅在腓立比書二:12 提到的「作成我們得救的工夫。」相關的教導還有雅各書一:21-22 提到的信心與行為的並行,「脫去一切的污穢和盈餘的邪惡,存溫柔的心領受那所栽種的道,就是能救你們靈魂的道。聽道也要行道。」可見一個人的信心是與他的行為並行的,而且信心因著行為才得成全。

#### 結語

「你看父賜給我們是何等的慈愛,使我們得稱為上帝的兒女。」(約壹三:1a)。「上帝的神能已將一切關乎生命和虔敬的事賜給我們,皆因我們認識那用自己榮耀和美德召我們的主。因此,祂已將又寶貴又極大的應許

賜給我們,叫我們既脫離世上從情慾來的敗壞,就得與上帝的性情有分。」(彼後一:3-4)

回想到一位姐妹曾跟我說:我真羨慕你,因你是第三代基督徒,而你女兒是第四代,真是一個蒙福的家庭。 我一直以來,都沒有把我是第幾代基督徒放在心内,只深知我有一個愛主的母親。 但經過這次的談話後,我有點兒驚慌,更加有點兒恐懼。我女兒的子女,我的孫兒們會不會敬虔的接受這個

「福音棒」,把神的福音一代一代的傳下去,願神憐憫。

當編輯把《一生愛主的第二代》交給我時, 我不拒絕的把它看完。這書是作者李道宏牧 師在《愛主第二代系列》的第三本書,指出 第二代信仰問題的存在,再一次印證以聖經 的原則教導孩子的重要性,作者用很多啓發 及思考問題引導父母們。

李牧師指出,為什麼父母絕不能給孩子們有 選擇宗教的自由,父母要在家裡做屬靈的教育,而不是把責任交由教會的主日學。引導 他們更深認識神的救恩,夫妻在家的角色是 家庭的基石。 提醒我們不要作個失職的父 母親。

「學壞三日,學好十年」,家長們要及早幫助孩子們,建立一些能互相在主裡造就的朋友。「十年樹木,百年樹人」,第二代的心田需要父母們鬆土、撒種、耕耘、維護,好叫神的話能落在好土裡,扎根成長。

在孩子成長過程上,父母們都著意為子女有平衡的 IQ (Intelligent Quotient 智商)、EQ (Emotional Quotient 情商)發展,絞盡腦汁用各類不同的方法去培育他們。 那麼SQ (Spiritual Quotient 靈商)又怎樣呢?我們作家長的,會否在這方面,要花上九牛二虎之力去提升兒女們的靈商呢?

作者更進一步將孩子們分為「以撒型」、「雅各型」、「以掃型」,從他們的長短處和屬靈的取向,去了解他們,用不同的方法,重新把他們帶回神的面前。 你的孩子屬那一類型?請在書內尋找答案。

#### 讀 經 的 藝 淅

#### 陳梅

費戈登(Gordon Fee)所著《讀經的藝術》,曾被指定為神學生的必讀書目。書中描述了人們讀經時常有的困惑和誤解,以及如何走出不當解釋聖經的誤區,讓真理按照本來面目呈現在人們眼前。

費戈登認為,解經不是牧者和神學生的專屬工作,而是每個人都應當花時間學習的一種思維方式。我們讀經的時候其實就已經開始了解釋聖經的過程,試圖跨越時空文化的差異去理解聖經作者想表達的原意。有些差異容易跨越,對經文的解釋也就正確,比如,今天我們再讀提後 4章 13 節時,沒有人會去幫保羅拿外衣。而有些差異就不那麼明顯,最明顯的例子就是,使徒時代教會的行為是否是今天教會的規范?即便是同樣信奉使徒信經的主流傳統宗派,對這個問題的回答也都不盡相同。

從上面的例子可以看出,聖經永遠的適用性和歷史特定情境之間存在著張力。歷史特定情境的產生是因為神選擇人作為代言人,人描述啓示時會受到語言環境的限制。如果沒有意識到這一點,我們就會自然而然地認為,"基於我所用譯本的經文的字面描述,我得到的理解是正確的。"所以,正確的解經的確需要一些神學教育,疑難經文的解釋則更需要依賴受過神學訓練的學者和牧者。聖經是神的話語,正確的解經會使人得著鼓勵和安慰,由衷地贊美神。而另一方面,有些經文學者們有超過 40 種解釋!這也提醒我們,人是有限的,無法用理性圓滿地解釋

神的作為。所以,我們應當謙卑俯伏在造物 主的腳前,用基督信仰來跨越未知的地帶, 與神相連。

雖然費戈登的信仰背景屬於五旬節派,但是他更像是一個綜合各家之長的學者。他甚至對五旬節派的一些基本教義持反對態度,解經的嚴謹、信仰的平衡、對神的敬畏都不遜於福音派的學者。《讀經的藝術》倘若潛心閱讀,定受益匪淺!

# To Renew Energy by Being Quiet and At Rest

Many people nowadays are simply "busy". We love being busy and hate it as well, because being busy gives some people affirmation that is hard to obtain elsewhere. It comforts people with the idea that they are not idle, and it makes people feel that they are making progress. "Busy" becomes synonymous to "hopeful".

In fact, being busy is often unsettling. It strains the tension of our lives, squeezes the room for human feelings, and distances people from each other. Being busy makes many people feel like being a small screw of a huge machine, losing their control of life. We often hear people say: "Once you're in the real world, you lose yourself."

Being busy is like riding a rollercoaster with sudden excitements and shocks, but the person on it is totally out of control until the rollercoaster stops when he can unbuckle and take a breath.

At a closer look, we see that the Chinese character "busy" consists of "heart" and "death". Does it mean that being endlessly busy we can easily lose our spiritual perception and fail to see many graces of God in our lives? How can an exhausted person quiet down to experience the Holy Spirit?

When we drive, we are constantly reminded to drive within the speed limit; however, we often speed thinking that it does not matter to do so once in a while. By the same token, we often tell ourselves that things will be fine after this busy period of time. Let's examine a fact: how many people can suddenly become still and quiet? Being busy is a need deeply rooted in modern people's psyche, for being not busy for even a day makes us won-

der if we have failed our day. We wonder if we will be abandoned by society if we do not keep ourselves busy. Does it mean we lag behind if we are not busy?

In 2009, I was misled by this "business". Pastors must often focus on prayer and spiritual progress, which I apparently lacked, not because I didn't want to, but because I was busy with worldly matters that could never be completed. I delayed what was originally more important.

Isaiah 30:15 says: "For thus saith the Lord GOD, the Holy One of Israel; In returning and rest shall ye be saved; in quietness and in confidence shall be your strength: and ye would not."

To receive the power and help from the Lord, we must slow down in this busy world. The fact is that this world seeks efficiency, speed and economy. Technology has shrunk the globe, with supersonic airplanes, the internet and the like. Have they actually reduced the working hours? Are we really getting the much needed rest?

The accelerated pace of life has cost us a great deal, including what we should value as part of our spiritual life. We get busier everyday, probably too busy to have time to nurture and enjoy friendship. We are constantly reminded to pay attention to the needs of others, driving our minds and bodies to exhaustion.

The death of heart is a dreadful thing, so we should stop to ask ourselves a practical question: "What are you so busy for?"

God wants us to go back to Him to get energized. We must first rest, observe and look up to His work. How can we pay attention to what is really important in life if we are as busy as the cars flying by.

I am not sure what your life is like today, but I know one thing: if you really want a rich life, you should have the courage and humility to come to God first for his help to rest your heart. Trust in God, submit your restless heart, surrender your authority and restore

the intimate relationship with God. You could very well be busy with what God considers meaningless!

## Spiritual Gifts and the Executive Board

In 2009 our church's theme was to prepare God's people for works of service. This was taken from Ephesians 4:12. In the same chapter 4, the apostle Paul also discussed spiritual gifts from Christ (v.11- It was he who gave some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some to be evangelists, and some to be pastors and teachers). # Mission Department: From "Seeing" To "Taking Action"

Thank God for giving me the opportunity to participate and learn how to serve in mission-

ary work; with the pastors' leadership and guidance and with the support of a group of dear colleagues, we continued to complete all the objectives in 2009. Other than participating in the existing planned missions, we piloted the training sessions for short-term missions and the South Asian cross-cultural training seminars. In addition to the annual mission conference, we did the following three missions, through which God had broadened my exposure and learning experience:

#### 1. Northern Thailand Mission

Last March, I was fortunate to join three fellow brothers and sisters from the English congregation to serve the English Holy Bible classes for the children in Northern Thailand and Myanmar. I saw their God-given compassion and vitality displaying His love to these lovely innocent children. Also, I saw the real shortage of God's servants in this region, especially those who could provide spiritual training. God also let us see a different scenario.

#### Review of the Past

In 2000, our church co-operated with the Gospel Operation International in sending Brother Keith Lee (now Rev. Lee) and his family over there to serve and pioneer missionary work. In 2005, Rev. Ming Wong visited the same district. The following year, Rev. Conrad Kwok went there to teach in the Bethel Bible Institute and the Operation Dawn Disciples Training Centre as well as serve in the missionary. Subsequently our fellow brothers and sisters also began participating in some short-term missions. Today the Thailand and Myanmar mission has become an ongoing mission event in our church. During these mission periods, God had let us see the need of local Chinese people and the minority people from the mountain area, especially their younger generation - their children and youths: the need to spread the Gospel to them, the need to mould their spiritual lives, the need to train disciples and the need to

take care of their lives. We also had witnessed the establishment of many student centres and training centres. "The crops are ready for harvest but we don't have enough workers to reap the crops!"

#### New Vision

In recent years, we have seen God's blessing in the region nicknamed the "the Golden Triangle for the Gospel" to allow the Gospel to continue to spread there. Its close proximity to Myanmar and Laos, China's Yuannan in the North and Vietnam to the West made it the centre for great missionary work and training disciples.

Recently, we also learned from our local coworkers that the two universities in suburb of Qinlai had more than 600 students from China. In addition, over 1,000 Thai students studied the Chinese Language there. Spreading the Gospel to these university students may become a necessity.

God has shown us that this region has great potential for the Gospel. If we have a fixed plan to support local training, to develop partnership with local missionary organizations and to promote collaboration, then we can have an annual Northern Thailand short-term mission servicing the local children and students properly. In this way, we are no longer just sending a short-term missionary team there without any specific targets but gradually implementing the plan set up by the Mission Department 2 years ago and consolidating our resources. If this vision is really coming from God, then may God grant us blessing for a successful growth.

## 2. Quebec - Short-term Mission for Oujé Natives

Thanks for all the hard work of two sisters and three youths who formed the short-term mission team jointly with members from a church in Toronto. Together they completed the mission. We hope that we will be able to form our own team in 2010, to motivate many more youths to join the short-term mission and to continue passing the burning torch forward. Though I did not join the mission, I was greatly encouraged. I heard the following story from

the mission sharing session. One of our sisters asked the Chinese reverend and his wife, "Why are you serving in this remote area and not in Toronto?" They answered, "We stayed to serve the aboriginals here because we are less-gifted". The answer had moved me and shamed me! Rather than saying that they were inadequate, it was more fitting to say that I was the one who was inadequate for I did not have their humility, obedience and passion for the mission.

### 3. Milton Mission - Church Planting

Last year we began implementing the church planting plan in Milton. In spite of some deficiencies, I was amazed to see the Gospel foundation site and the love, the persistent faith and the diligent work of a group of coworkers from the church. Also I thank God for His grace in allowing us to participate in this mission. At first, I participated because of my role in the Mission Department. I was limited by my language skill and my knowledge in theology. Armed with only my willingness, I followed my pastors to visit and attend the needs of immigrants from China, the needs of those who were seeking the Gospel and the needs of local Christians. In addition to seeing their thirst for the Gospel, we were surprised to see the dire need for family counselling. Thus our pastors were making quite an effort to travel between the two cities and provide spiritual guidance while I stood by their sides looking shocked, feeling ashamed and guilty and not doing much other than looking after some trivial business.

#### Self Reflection

I continued to question myself: God had shown me the needs of people both from inside and outside the church. How could I still avoid facing those needs? How could I still excuse myself by saying, "I don't have the gift and I am not ready to deal with people face to face"? In one of the mission workers fellowship meetings, I was so thankful for God's guidance through the prayer of a dear sister, which moved me to start taking action to equip myself for His work; God, through the testimonies of pastors, elders, brothers and sisters, had encouraged me to enroll in a comprehensive and fundamental training in

Theology. In reflecting on what did happen, I realized that God had already guided and prepared us each step of the way. The only thing that mattered was whether we would be willing to take the first step!

Many years ago I was puzzled by my working life. I was so lonely and helpless. In my prayers, I asked God, "Who is the boss? Who can give me support?" God answered me clearly. I still had the Almighty God from Heaven. This had liberated me from my tears and sufferings. From that point onward, I only viewed my career as one part of my life and wanted to live for the Lord. Later on I prayed to God regularly asking for clear direction on my life: What is His plan for the rest of my life? What would He like me to do? Where would He want me to go? But He did not give me an answer. Later on I realized that God had already commanded me so just as what was said in Mathew 28:19-20, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age". He wanted me to base on faith and follow Him step by step everyday!

Out of concern and worry, many dear brothers and sisters advised me, "At this age of your life, are you able to handle physically and mentally the rigorous and intensive fulltime study in theology?" I had also raised the same question myself. But I could no longer delay my response to God's calling. I had placed the rest of my life in God's hands so that He could mold and shape me. I believed that capabilities come from God and I just had to do my best. Recently I have thought about the same issue again. It seems to me that God still wants me to learn how to be humble and obedient in my life, to keep on equipping myself, not to boast about my abilities but to lean on Him completely and live in His grace! Actually my classmates have already provided such testimonies when they shared their experiences.

In serving the Mission Department, I was supposed to learn to encourage everybody to have a passion for missionary work. But to my surprise, I was encouraged and supported by my dear brothers and sisters to go study in a

theology school, and willingly let Him renew and mold my spiritual life into His useful vessel. I would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for your love and kindness. May we share the abundance of His grace given to our church.

My dear brothers and sisters, let us encourage each other to experience and be moved by going through the following stages:
"Knowing" → "Feeling" → "Thinking" →
"Taking Action". Let us rise, take charge, help each other, and perform our duties so that our church becomes a dynamic and action-oriented missionary church. May all the glory and praise be to God!

## Chinese Sunday School 2009

As the Chinese Sunday School Executive Board member, I was not working hard at all. Praise to our Lord for our pastors and their wives, who have been very much enthusiastic in continuing the curriculum they started last year. Thank God for the excellent resources we got for the programs. I have heard some very good feedback in response to the programs.

Although I didn't practice, there were some interesting thoughts that circled in my mind from time to time. Since the ideas did not go anywhere, and I did not share it with the new Sunday School Department head, I just want to share them with you now.

There must be something I can improve!

Guest preachers can be quite independent; they come and deliver a message, and then they leave. I tried emails, gatherings, and phone call sharing to establish a learning relationship. It is very time consuming, but commitment is fundamental to be a good study partner.

Normally, when I prepare for lessons I study books, read articles on the internet, and sometimes even attend seminars, but what I end up delivering in class is usually only a fraction of materials I collect and/or absorb. At the end, I know more than before! Trying to be good is a blessing.

Teaching is a blessing. Learning is a blessing. There are challenges for each member of the study team. With God's grace, we should all teach to learn and learn to teach, helping each other to grow in the Word of our Lord and glorify His Name in every day of our lives!

## **English Sunday School 2009**

### Hoi LI

First of all, I would like to express my deepest appreciation and thanksgiving to all the Sunday school teachers and helpers for their faithful commitment to the kingdom of God in BCBC. With love and devotion, we pray that our Lord will bless and reward them in many ways.

The English Sunday School is currently divided into three classes: Grade 7-8, Grade 9-12 and Adult. Their needs in God's Word are different in terms of the depth and scope, yet they all have one thing in common - the need for committed and motivated brothers and sisters to help serve faithfully in this ministry.

A series titled The Truth Project was introduced to the adult class this year and received a very positive feedback. The following is a brief introduction to The Truth Project:

The Truth Project from Focus on the Family is a DVD-based small group curriculum comprised of 12 one-hour lessons taught by Dr. Del Tackett. This home study is the starting point for looking at life from a biblical perspective. Each lesson discusses in great detail the relevance and importance of living the Christian worldview in daily life.

1 - Veritology: What is Truth?

The Truth Project begins by defining truth as "that which corresponds to reality." This absolute and eternal truth, at the heart of Jesus'

mission on earth, continues to be the focal point of the Cosmic Battle in our own time.

### 2 - Philosophy and Ethics: Says Who?

Truth is not simply an academic concept. The way we think about truth has a direct bearing upon the way we live our lives. What's more, our understanding of right and wrong is directly dependent on our worldview: Is the universe God's creation or a closed cosmic cube?

### 3 - Anthropology: Who is Man?

The Bible tells us that man was created in God's image but fell from innocence through sin. Modern psychology, on the other hand, asserts that man is inherently good and behaves badly only under the influence of social or institutional pressure. This lesson explores the implications of both views.

### 4 - Theology: Who is God?

Eternal life, according to Jesus, is knowing God in an intimate, personal, and relational way. Such knowledge, which is possible only because of divine revelation, transforms us from the inside out as we begin to see ourselves in the light of His majesty and holiness.

#### 5 - Science: What is True?

Science, the "systematic study of the natural world," brings to light innumerable evidences of Intelligent Design. But Darwinian theory transforms science from the honest investigation of nature into a vehicle for propagating a godless philosophy. (Part One)

A careful examination of molecular biology and the fossil record demonstrates that evolution is not a "proven fact." Meanwhile, history shows that ideas, including Darwinism as a social philosophy, have definite consequences - consequences that can turn ugly when God is left out of the picture. (Part Two)

### 6 - History: Whose Story?

Does the past have an objective actuality and significance? Or does it, as postmodernist philosophy asserts, exist primarily inside our heads? This tour considers the meaning of history as God's story and shows us why remembering is so important.

#### 7 - Sociology: The Divine Imprint

The order we observe in the natural realm is even more apparent in the social systems God has established: family, church, community, state, labor, and the union between God and man. Life is a series of relationships that flow out of and reflect the Trinitarian nature of the Creator.

#### 8 - Unio Mystica: Am I Alone?

Is it possible for the infinite, eternal Creator to dwell within the heart of an individual? The implications of this great mystery, which represents the very core of the Christian faith, are explored at length in this examination of the most intimate of the social spheres.

#### 9 - The State: Whose Law?

Of all the social spheres, the state, to which God grants the power of the sword for the punishment of evil and the preservation of the good, has the greatest potential to go awry if it oversteps its authority. The civil magistrate must always remember his place under the sovereignty of God - otherwise, havoc will ensue.

## 10 - The American Experiment: Stepping Stones

America is unique in the history of the world. On these shores a people holding to a biblical worldview have had an opportunity to set up a system of government designed to keep the state within its divinely ordained boundaries. Tour #10 follows the history of this experiment and explores what happens to freedom when God is forgotten.

#### 11 - Labor: Created to Create

Contrary to a great deal of contemporary

popular opinion, work is not a "curse." God Himself is active and creative, and He calls man to share in the joy of His activity and creativity. Labor, economics, media, and the creative arts all have a role to play in magnifying the glory of the Creator.

12 - Community and Involvement: God Cares, do !?

The ethical law and the meaning of the Christian life are summed up in the commandment to love God and one's neighbour. This command is the source of the believer's motivation for self-sacrificial service to the needy and their personal involvement in our culture.

I would like to express my sincere thanks to our brother Denny for his contribution and devotion in leading this program. We plan on bringing the same program to the grade 9-12 class in the coming years. The Truth Project can be a good starting point to build up the spirit of our young generation and lead them in becoming more Christ like. We will need a lot of support from our fellow brothers and sisters to:

- 1. Be the good example walk an extra mile,
- 2. Be involved in ministry part of God's kingdom, and
- 3. Learn from our mistakes forgiveness.

In closing, let's work together to build up the kingdom of God, and remember Paul's teaching to Timothy:

"Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity." -1 Timothy 4:12

## **Bringing Up The Next Generation**

The most common mistakes parents make are to:

- 1. exasperate our children;
- 2. say angry, hurtful words to them when we are irritable;
- 3. show favouritism among children;
- 4. fail to balance between love and discipline;
- 5. fail to communicate with them;
- lose hope with prodigal sons and/or daughters;
- 7. never say sorry to our children;
- 8. focus only on their health and academic achievements but ignore their spiritual development and prayers;
- 9. compare them with other children;
- 10. not take every opportunity to teach them God's Words and the Bible and
- 11. not set an example in language and action consistent with the teaching.

The Bible teaches fathers in these verses:

"Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord" (Ephesians 6:4)

"Fathers, do not embitter your children, or they will become discouraged." (Colossians 3:21)

### <u>Bible's View on the Relationship Between</u> Father and Son

#### Jacob (Genesis 37:3-4)

"Now Israel loved Joseph more than any of his other sons because he had been born to him in his old age and he made a richly ornamented robe for him. When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than any of them, they hated him and could not speak a kind word to him."

Favouritism among children causes jealousy or even hatred among siblings.

#### Eli (1 Samuel 2:12-30)

The priest Eli's two sons were wicked men who had no regard for the Lord. "Why do you honour your sons more than me?" asked the Lord. Children who sin and do evils will be judged accordingly. God will also judge parents who fail to bring up their children in the instruction of the Lord and rebuke them from sins.

#### David (2 Samuel 14:28-18:33)

Absalom lived in Jerusalem two years without seeing the king's face. (2 Samuel 14:28)..... Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel. (2 Samuel 15:6)...... A messenger came and told David, "The hearts of the men of Israel are with Absalom." Then David said to all his officials who were with him in Jerusalem, "Come! We must flee, or none of us will escape Absalom. We must leave immediately. or he will move quickly to overtake us and bring ruin upon us and put the city to the sword. (2 Samuel 15:13-15).....The king was shaken. He went up to the room over the gateway and wept. As he went, he said: "O my son Absalom! My son, my son Absalom! If only I had died, instead of you - O Absalom, my son, my son!" (2 Samuel 18:33)

King David's relationship with his son Absalom was a real tragedy. There was absolutely no communication. How could a father not see his son for two years while living in the same city? There was a complete breakdown of the relationship. Absalom stole the hearts of the men of Israel and schemed to take over the father's throne. A battle of life and death began resulting in the escape of King David. Finally the revolt failed and Absalom died. Winning over his son was no good news to David. He was devastated over the death of his son. What a family tragedy!

The Parable of the prodigal son (Luke 15:11-32)

Who wouldn't despair and lose hope with a prodigal son? This father waited patiently and never lost hope. Finally the younger son repented and came home. The Father was overjoyed and put on a big celebration. The older son was jealous and angry. Not only was the father not discouraged, he patiently pleaded with him to take joy in the return of his lost brother.

I can see all of the fruit of the Spirit in the father: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control. Every word of the father was so beautifully spoken. May we all learn from this parable!

I admire the young adults in the English service when they come in early and park along the street to save room for those that come in late. I also applaud our Sunday school classmates who come early and park across the street to make rooms for others.

What a small token to show your love and care to others, and our Lord will repay you with more than you can think of.

So, do we have any parking issue?

Yes, if we are not considerate.

Or, no, if we are willing to walk few more steps.
